

Drift by Jamie North

Drift consists of nine large rock sculptures located along La Trobe Street at the frontage of Home Docklands. Each rock is modelled from blast-furnace slag or molten steel by-product that has a distinct volcanic appearance.





Water Spirit by Vipoo Sirivalsa

Srivilasa's playfully oversized *Water Spirit* provides a symbol of inclusivity, joy and friendship. Its decorative embellishments are familiar elements of the artist's work, along with the water-inspired mosaic, which offers a sense of peace and harmony.





Time Talker by Alexander Knox

Time Talker is a sculptural stack of Blue Mussel shells arranged into a humanlike totemic figure, referencing a time when the Docklands and extensive shell middens formed the wetlands ecosystem of the Birrarung (Yarra Delta).





Quietly Flowing by Meagan Streader

Quietly Flowing is a multi-dimensional light installation that weaves its way through the grand concrete columns of the building's façade. Minimal and sophisticated in its form, the artwork reflects the rhythm and flow of the nearby Birrarung (Yarra River).
